**Sale of one house will provide a cluster of homes in El Salvador**  
***Airdrie Mayor will officially launch project June 26, 2007***

AIRDRIE. Whoever buys a beautiful luxury home in Luxstone Park Estates will experience a great deal more than its comfort and pleasure.

The new owners will be a part of project that will contribute about 50 homes for the disadvantaged people of Las Brisas, El Salvador.

The 2,000 sq. ft. home has been built as a "Hope for El Salvador Project" by Vesta Properties Ltd, in partnership with EMCC World Partners, a global ministry of the Evangelical Missionary Church of Canada (EMCC).

Airdrie Mayor Linda Bruce, representatives of Vesta Properties and EMCC World Partners, will host a ribbon-cutting ceremony at the home, 2200 Luxstone Blvd., Airdrie, on Tuesday, June 26, 2007 at 11:30 am to officially launch this project.

About 70 per cent of the profits from the sale of the home will go to Las Brisas, a community of 120 families devastated by an earthquake in 2004, and with no infrastructure or resources available to them.

Paul Brander, Director of International Operations of EMCC World Partners, says that since 2004, 54 homes and a community building have been built, plus help with getting electricity and water to Las Brisas, under this mission.

"Now, through the sale of this home, it looks like we will be close to providing homes for the entire community of these extremely disadvantaged people," Brander says.

World Partners volunteers work directly with the local people, erecting pre-fab houses at a cost of \$2,800 (CDN), complete with windows, doors and concrete floors. "This Airdrie project with Vesta Properties has been an unbelievable blessing and encouragement to our work in El Salvador," Brander adds.

The new owners of *Casa de Las Brisas* will also realize that their home will help expand urgent recreation and community needs for a new East Lake Recreation & Wellness Centre in Airdrie. About 30 per cent of the profits from the sale will go towards Phase II of this project that will house a multi-purpose facility providing two indoor soccer fields (also to be used as a multi-purpose centre), an indoor running track and gymnastics facility.

Lynn Harrison, Marketing Director, Vesta Properties Ltd., says that the home developer decided to become a partner in these two important projects. "because we believe that this is a fantastic opportunity to support both the El Salvador project to help disadvantaged families have homes and, to support the community of Airdrie where we are building homes and neighbourhoods for families.

The media are invited for a tour of the show home on June 26 after the official ceremony. All representatives of the joint project will be available for interviews.
